

PE Grant 2018/19 Impact and Evaluation Report

Abbey Hulton Primary School received an additional £17,772 to spend on PE for 2018/19.

We are aiming to build up the profile of sport in our school, creating a positive and sustainable ethos towards sport, exercise, fitness and health.

<u>£1500 membership to the OPEN network</u> <u>£500 membership to schools sports partnership</u> 1. Membership into this network leading to PD and advice on the PE curriculum 2.	1. Teachers will all receive some form of PD over the year including professional coaches teaching alongside teachers in Gymnastics and Dance. 2. Teachers to be sent on courses and the Keele conference to increase their knowledge of particular sports to then teach to their class. 3. Advice and support given to the PE lead to keep up to date with government recommendations and initiatives. 4. Fitzy training and promotion given to foundation and year 1.	New PE lead has some improved confidence in taking on this role in school. Money spent on schools sports partnership has been effective in allowing us to go to over 11 competitions competing against other schools in the region in a wide range of sports. Some teachers have received CPD PE training to help develop confidence in PE delivery. Advice and support given to new PE lead on OPEN network and what it offers.
<u>£2500 clubs</u> 1. Bee Active to provide a lunch time club, breakfast club and afterschool club.	1. To increase participation in sport and general fitness of children. 2. To create an interest and love of sport with a variety of sports being offered across the year.	Children are engaged in physical activity in lessons and after school in clubs. Participation in clubs after school is strong. Clubs include Change for Life multi skills run by Bee Active and a twice weekly school football Club, Stoke City led football coaching, Chance to Shine Cricket Club and previously a Netball Club. Children have equal opportunities to attend sports clubs and sports competitions and this has been tracked closely by the PE lead- please see for further breakdown/data. Specific groups are targeted to ensure equal opportunities for sports activity.

Following the success of the KS2 trim trail we are installing one on KS1 playground	Trim trail installed onto KS1 playground is very effective and helping to combat childhood obesity. KS1 children use it daily and the feedback is very positive. KS2 Playground leaders have been trained in helping to deliver physical activity opportunities at lunch and break times.

Paying for the children to be able to enter competitions and transport costs, costs incurred to cover the staff who take them there.	1. This will allow children to access competitions and festivals. Giving them a purpose to the sports they have been taught. Developing teamwork and communication. Developing a sense of leadership and sportsmanship. The enjoyment of participating with others will lead to a willingness to keep up the sport and progress with it. 2. This will raise the profile of sport in the school and with parents. Encouraging support from parents and a change in attitude to a healthier more active life style.	We sustained Gold this year for our participation in School Games. We have attended over 14 competitions this year and the funding has helped to pay for transport to and from venues. Children's confidence in sports is improving and they are being exposed to a wider range of sporting opportunities e.g. Danish Longball, Futsall and Athletics.
